## Sunday Projection

As we approach the end of the year, I thought it would be an appropriate time to write a short piece about the projection of all the worship material on Sunday mornings.

Earlier this year, I took it upon myself to provide a short session after a morning service to give members of the congregation the opportunity to have a look behind the scenes at the work we do on the laptop each Sunday morning. I was delighted with the turnout, and the feedback I received afterwards was all very positive. At the time, we had a team of four people - Richard, Phil, Ron and myself, all working on a rotational basis. So roughly once a month we would each take a turn at "the controls". There were times though when it did get a bit tricky to provide cover, particularly during holiday periods. It was for that reason that I was keen to expand the team, and I was delighted when Robbie come forward after the session to learn more. He has since been fully integrated into the rota, and with his expertise we are now able to project live footage of some services onto the screen via a camera mounted on the balcony. This provides anyone sitting up there with a better view of proceedings.

I'm sure you will agree that what we do really enhances our time of worship, particularly when it comes to singing. Our voices are projected more when looking up at the screen as opposed to down at the books. Also, the other material that is used such as pictures for the children and video clips add greatly to the overall experience. However, we are aware that occasionally the choice of colours and background can be slightly problematic for some. If you have any comments on that, or any other aspect, please speak to whoever is on duty after the service, and we will ensure that the issue is rectified appropriately for the next time.

My thanks go to all those in our team for doing such a great job. Particular thanks to Richard and the Minister, who put together the material each week. I'm very grateful to you all.
