Just a glance at the commandments is enough to remind us of their importance today. It's probably true to say that they have never been so relevant. They deal with life & death issues such as greed & theft, murder, relationships, work & rest, how we treat the elderly, truth & lies, and of course our attitude and relationship to God. All of life is there.

And can you visualise a world in which these instructions from God were actually obeyed? A world without cheating, lying, greed, murder, etc? Just imagine it - we'd be able to live without locks on our doors . . or anti-virus software!

But of course it's not so easy. The sort of society envisaged by Tolstoy (have you been watching 'War & Peace'?) where the Sermon on the Mount was the only law, and police forces and armies could be disbanded; that sort of society still eludes us.

But as the Reformers discovered, God's law drives us to Christ. In Him, all things are possible. And even when we transgress, there is grace, forgiveness, and a new beginning.

I hope that will be our experience during this time, and as we anticipate Lent and then the glory of Easter.

Another: 'How can you actually KNOW Jesus?' It was great to have seventeen of them turn up for their Christmas lunch party.

Bethany Report January 2016

Abbey supplied meals for the Bethany Care Shelter three times towards the end of 2015. Sadly, the numbers were considerably up on last year. Each time there were about 50 homeless people mostly men though several girls too. On the 22nd December, because of fire and safety regulations, the venue only allowed 35 into the building and up to 20 were turned away. It was very upsetting but we managed to give hot food and drinks to some outside along with sleeping bags and blankets. When we left after 11.00pm, there were several people sleeping on the pavement. On this occasion we supplied gift bags with warm socks, hats, gloves, toiletries and sweets etc. Thanks to everyone who helped and for the generous donations of money, warm clothing etc. Anderson the Butcher donated pies and North Berwick Dental Practice toothpaste. We have a healthy balance of £580 in the bank and we go again on the 28th February and 18th April. The teams who are going have still to be finalised. Clean warm sleeping bags and blankets are still needed and can be handed into the office.


