Dear Abbey & Dirleton Friends,

I recently got a copy of a new booklet called 'Student Church Guide'. Its purpose is to help people find a church when they have moved away from home to study. It covers the main cities in Scotland.

For a small booklet, it's a mine of information, and makes interesting reading for anyone. It could also come in useful if you're just visiting another city some Sunday!

I don't know how they selected the churches which are listed. But one striking thing is how dramatically the church scene has changed recently. Half or more of the churches listed could broadly be called 'new', not just because they weren't there a few years ago, but also because they are not part of the traditional denominations. Their style of worship and 'doing church' is contemporary. They often attract large congregations, many of them young, and are very active in outreach and church-planting. Very few of them describe their worship style as 'traditional', nearly all are 'contemporary' or 'blended'.

I wonder if we have something to learn here? It's always interesting to visit a different church service (something parish ministers don't often get the chance to do!). I have some copies of the booklet if you'd like one. And if you get the chance to visit one of them, please let me know what you thought of it.

# Comments - Abbey Church (All Funds) - Six months to 30 June 2018

## General

The deficit for the half year was £72,933, this mainly relates to the further expenditure on the Old Hall of £86,006. This was financed by the drawing down of bank accounts deposited in past years.

## Income

Offerings - These are less than budget but ahead of the amount received last year. The amount received in the bank by standing order continues to increase however the 'blue envelope' and the open plate giving continue to decline.

*(Note - If you are tax payer and wish the Abbey to recover the tax paid by yourself please would you pick up a gift-aid form from the office or ask Phil for one.)*

## Expenditure

The new building project has been completed at a cost of £86,006 to date. This amount covers both the seminar room and the refit of the Old Hall. Further bills are still being received.

Premises costs are below budget, this includes the purchase and installation of the radiators in the New Hall. A planned maintenance programme should mean that premises costs will increase.

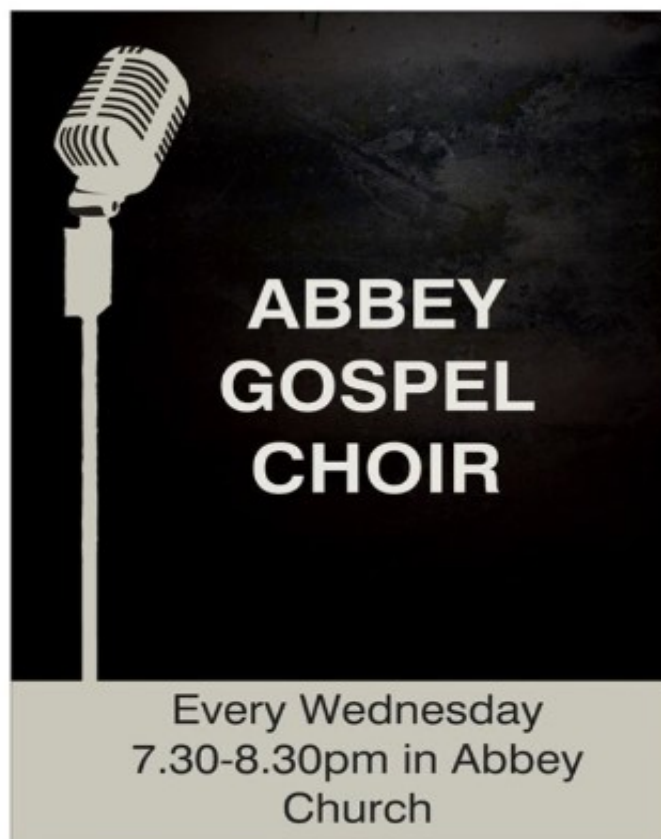
