Dirleton Wednesdays 10am Half Hour Prayer Service Dear Abbey and Dirleton friends,

Jeanette Wilson, who did a summer placement with us last year, sends us this update on her training.

As I write this, my initial phase of training is almost complete. Time has flown by. I have completed two years part time study at New College, even though at times it has felt like full time! In my final term, I had two modules this term: Christian Ethics, where we looked at topics ranging from poverty, the environment, truth and migration and borders. These are all important subjects to consider as we navigate living as Christians in our fallen world. The other module was Mission in Contemporary Scotland. Most of the small class were Church of Scotland candidates for ministry. While it is an academic program, I have enjoyed the discussions and hearing the desire for God to move in our land. It has increased my desire to share the Gospel in my ministry, both now as I train and looking forward to where God will lead me. I had one remaining assignment and an exam to complete in May.

I am also coming to the end of my third placement at Greenlaw Parish Church. It has been a great opportunity to minister to the small congregation there but also get involved with the work the Rev Dr Susan Brown has been doing by creating an online resource for worship. Each week, as well as doing in person worship, the same service is videoed as individual elements and placed online beforehand for the use of churches that maybe do not have a minister. They don't have to use the whole service but can cherry pick what they need whether in video form or just as scripts that can be adapted as people wish: prayers, reflections, songs. It has been a lesson in being organised and having everything ready several days before the in-person service. Each of my placements have been so profitable, shaping me into the person God wants to serve the church as a minister. I also pray that I have been a blessing to the churches in my placements.

I have my annual review in June and then I will begin my probation, probably in July/August. This is a 15 month period where I work full time with a church. At the end of that time, I hopefully will be able to look for a charge to commence my ministry. Following prayer and discussions with the Training team, I am hoping to do my probation with Rev Nelu Balaj at Livingston Old parish. This will mean relocating for the year. Please pray for me as I look for accommodation and settle into a new church and area. I am more sure than ever that God is leading me by the right path and pray that I would continue to be moulded by him for the ministry ahead. I pray that I might take the aroma of Christ with me to all that I would minister. Thank you again for your continuing prayers. Yours in Christ, Jeanette

Abbey Kirk Session Robert Burgon



There have been several encouraging signs of hope in the life of the Abbey congregation over the last two months, not least in the numbers who joined us in our worship around Easter. Our joint Good Friday service with St Andrew Blackadder was well supported. On Easter Saturday, there was an amazing response to the Muddy Church kite making and flying event at North Berwick Country Park and it was so good to get positive reactions from the parents who brought their children along- on a lovely, sunny Saturday morning with just enough wind to allow the kites to fly. Muddy Church is an initiative which was first created by our Youth Worker, Hazel Gray, but is now led by a team of three, one each from Abbey, St Andrew Blackadder and St Baldred's churches. We celebrated the start of Easter Sunday morning with a larger than usual attendance at our 8.00am open air service on Elcho Green, followed by breakfast in the church hall and then a joyous service in church in which a large congregation celebrated the resurrection of our Lord.



On Friday 14 April, our Christian Aid Quiz took place in the church hall and proved to be a happy, fun-filled evening, with some of us

getting some of the right answers! The event raised over £400 for Christian Aid. After the magnificent Coronation Service in

Westminster Abbey on Saturday 6 May, we marked the occasion by opening the Abbey sanctuary on the afternoon of Monday 8 May for



Coronation Teas. A large team of volunteers supported this in so many ways- from planning, publicity, decorating the sanctuary (which was transformed into a café for the afternoon) to baking, serving and washing dishes. Organising an event like this is always prone to uncertainty. Will we have enough volunteers? Will the weather be too good or too bad for people to be out on the High Street? Will there be enough baking? Needless to say, any misgivings were swiftly dispelled. Every seat was filled within 20 minutes of opening the doors and we estimate that nearly 200 people came in during the two-hour event. It was a happy time of fellowship with many visitors joining us. Donations given on the afternoon totalled almost $\pm 1,100$ which will be shared equally between Christian Aid and the East Lothian Foodbank

On a less-positive note, we were advised in early May that the Mission Review Panel of the Church of Scotland had rejected our request that the decisions of the former Presbytery of Lothian relating to future ministry in Abbey and Dirleton should be reconsidered by the Presbytery. While, not entirely unexpected (the review was limited to a number of technical issues), this decision comes as a disappointment after a process which has been going on for more than three years. The message which came with the decision reminded us that Presbytery Plans are, in due course, to be subject to annual review and development and we are encouraged to engage with the new Presbytery in that process.

While the Abbey and Dirleton Kirk Sessions will not have the opportunity to discuss this outcome until a meeting in June, my feeling is that we have been called to share the message of the Gospel with those in our congregation and community and our response should be to continue the excellent work which our Minister, David, is carrying out. Although we may question the logic and equity behind the Presbytery's decision that we can do that work effectively with an allocation of 0.25 of a full-time equivalent whenever our current minister decides to retire or move on. I believe that we should pray for strength and God's guidance as we seek to fulfil the vision of our congregation for the 2020s which is "Growing in faith, in our prayer life and in our confidence in sharing the good news of the Gospel and growing in number in every aspect of our ministry."



Although I know that I am repeating myself, I would like all members of the congregation to remember that there is NO proposal to close either Abbey or Dirleton churches. I know that rumours about such closure have been circulating for some time, but they are simply not true and need to be challenged. We have a job to do. Let us all get on and do it!

General

Receipts exceeded payments by £631. This is much better than budget.

Income

Premises income is very much below budget. It is hoped that that receipts will be catch up with budget during the year! We are very grateful to the Andrews family for the receipt of $\pounds1,000$ shown in legacies.

Expenditure

Premises costs are currently below budget. The costs of the basement flood are collected in a suspense account, on receipt of an insurance payment the balance will be included in Premises costs. Additional to this there are some substantial bills outstanding!

With Church Office expenses an updated photocopier has been ordered. As this is leased it should not have a dramatic effect on Church Office expenses.
