Electoral Register

As our congregations have now become vacant, and plans are being made for the selection of a new Minister, we must prepare an Electoral Register of people who will be entitled to vote on matters including the selection of a Nominating Committee and the appointment of a Minister.

Those on the Dirleton and Abbey congregational rolls will be automatically placed on the Electoral Register.

If you worship with us regularly, are a member of another congregation, and wish to participate in the election of a new Minister, you are invited to hand a valid Certificate of Transference to one of the Session Clerks before 30 November 2025. If you are not a member of another congregation and wish to

participate in the election process, your name can be added to the Register as an adherent. In those circumstances, please complete one of the forms which will be available in church until 30 November 2025, when the Kirk Sessions will meet to make up the Electoral Register.

The World Church Committee seeks Abbey and Dirleton volunteers to help feed homeless and vulnerable people in Edinburgh, in partnership with North Berwick Christian Fellowship, Bethany Christian Trust, and Edinburgh City Mission. Volunteers can drive the care van (under 70), prepare or serve food, stock, or clean the van. NBCF runs the van one Monday a month, with regular or occasional help welcome.

Serving up to 70 people, the van leaves NB/Dirleton at 10:30 am and returns around 4 pm. Volunteers should communicate well, work calmly in a team, and respect Bethany's Christian ethos. Psalm 98

A psalm.

Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvellous things; his right hand and his holy arm have worked salvation for him. The Lord has made his salvation known and revealed his righteousness to the nations. He has remembered his love and his faithfulness to Israel; all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.

Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth, burst into jubilant song with music; make music to the Lord with the harp, with the harp and the sound of singing, with trumpets and the blast of the ram's horn— shout for joy before the Lord, the King.

Let the sea resound, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it. Let the rivers clap their hands, let the mountains sing together for joy; let them sing before the Lord, for he comes to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness and the peoples with equity.

Luke 21:5-19

Some of his disciples were remarking about how the temple was adorned with beautiful stones and with gifts dedicated to God. But Jesus said, "As for what you see here, the time will come when not one stone will be left on another; every one of them will be thrown down."

"Teacher," they asked, "when will these things happen? And what will be the sign that they are about to take place?"

He replied: "Watch out that you are not deceived. For many will come in my name, claiming, 'I am he,' and, 'The time is near.' Do not follow them. When you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened. These things must happen first, but the end will not come right away."

Then he said to them: "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes, famines and pestilences in various places, and fearful events and great signs from heaven.

"But before all this, they will lay hands on you and persecute you. They will deliver you to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors, and all on account of my name. This will result in your being witnesses to them. But make up your mind not to worry beforehand how you will defend yourselves. For I will give you words and wisdom that none of your adversaries will be able to resist or contradict.

You will be betrayed even by parents, brothers, relatives and friends, and they will put some of you to death. All men will hate you because of me. But not a hair of your head will perish. By standing firm you will gain life.
